File Folder Games



I bought a couple of books from Wintergreen called “File Folder Games” (one is for preschoolers, the other for kindergarten). My co-worker and I took the books apart, and we put the pages in a binder. We then made copies of each page, colored the pictures, cut them out and laminated them.

The pieces were then glued onto a file folder and the pieces that matched up with the ones attached to the file folder were placed in an envelope that attached to the back of the file folder to keep the pieces together for easy storage for the children. We found that the envelopes were getting ripped, so we replaced them with plastic ziploc sandwich bags with zipper seals.

The children know the difference between the two levels because the Preschool file folder games are mostly on white folders and the kindergarten games are on blue.

The preschool file folder games are mostly color matching, pattern matching, counting, shapes, and the alphabet. The kindergarten games include all those in the preschool, but are more challenging, and there are also rhyming games, opposites, upper and lower case alphabet, seasons and counting coins.

The preschool children love doing the different puzzles and are very excited when they move to the kindergarten level.

If any pieces are lost, we just re-copy the page, color it, laminate it, and voila—it’s replaced at no cost! With any other puzzle, we would have to throw it away if a piece was lost. We are keeping an eye out for the next books to be released. My class loves them so much! A great investment.

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
