

What to Expect During a Site Visit

- Contact from your regional advisor
- Let the advisor know if there is anything specific you need information on
- During the visit you and the advisor will fill out a site report together, this is information on the general activities of your Head Start Program.
- Your advisor will follow up with requests or resources identified during the visit
- The advisor can provide support and suggestions
- Help you brainstorm new ideas for program changes
- Provide info sessions or workshops for your staff
